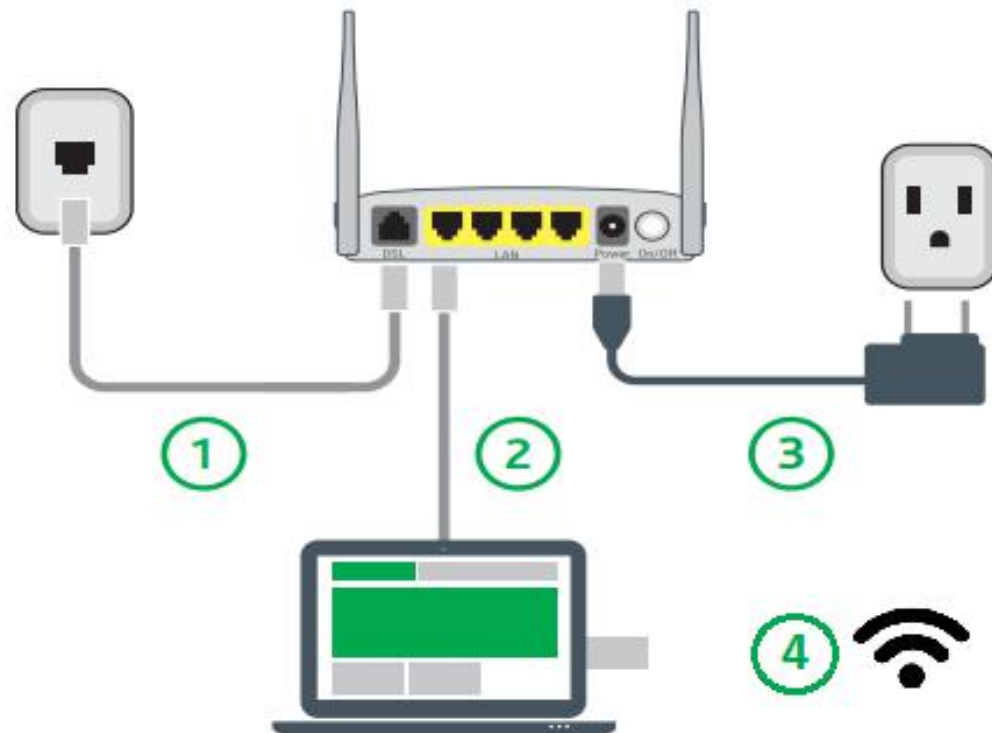

About your SmartRG SR506n



Your SmartRG SR506n modem has been configured by NCF and is ready for use, once your DSL service is active.

SETUP

Your modem comes with a phone cable, an Ethernet cable and a power adapter. The phone cable has narrower plugs than the Ethernet cable.

1. Connect the modem to the wall jack with the phone cable.
 - a. **For a Wet line (a line with active voice-service):** connect a DSL filter to any phone line in your residence where you have a telephone, answering machine or fax machine. Plug the filter into a phone wall jack – and then the phone device into the filter.
2. If you want to connect a device directly to the modem, plug the Ethernet cable into any port labelled LAN on your modem. Connect the other end of the cable to the Ethernet port on your device.
3. Plug the power adapter into a wall outlet and then into the back of your DSL modem. A power bar with a surge protector is recommended. Power-up the modem by pressing the ON/OFF button.
4. On your computer or device, select the WiFi network for your modem (Format: NCF_XXXX) and when asked for a “password” or “key” use the WiFi Password you were provided with your modem.

It takes up to a minute for the DSL light to illuminate after powering on the modem. You should ultimately have a solid green DSL light on the modem, and it is normal for the WiFi, LAN and Internet lights to flash occasionally, showing data moving.

CAUTION: PRESSING THE RESET BUTTON ON THE SIDE OF THE MODEM WILL ERASE THE MODEM’S CONFIGURATION ENSURING THE CONNECTION WILL NOT WORK.

TROUBLESHOOTING TIPS

Sometimes your DSL service can be interrupted or your initial activation might not occur smoothly. If you do have a problem, follow the steps on the next page.

1. If there is no DSL signal (i.e no solid green DSL light), turn your modem off, wait ten seconds, then turn your modem back on again. Wait five minutes for modem to start – if no DSL light, proceed to step two.
2. Trace the phone cable from the wall jack to the modem and ensure it is plugged in securely on both ends (it should click in and not come loose with a small tug).
3. If you have a Wet line, ensure you haven't put a filter on the line that goes into your modem, and that all telephones have filters plugged into the phone wall jack, and are themselves plugged into the filter to prevent interference. Use the phone cable that came with the modem or one less than two metres long.
4. Check to see if there is a telephone jack at your home's Demarcation Point and plug in your modem there. This is the location inside your home where the Bell wires enter through the wall from outside.
5. If you still have no DSL signal, and the service was operational beforehand, please contact NCF via 613-721-1773 and press "0" OR email us at support@ncf.ca for assistance.

Note that wiring INSIDE your home is your responsibility. The quality of in-home wiring varies greatly, particularly in older homes. Search the Internet using terms such as "home networking wiring Ottawa" for contractors who will repair your wiring. If Bell needs to make repairs to your inside wiring, there will be a charge that will be passed on to you.

Having trouble with a poor WiFi signal in certain areas of your home?

1. Sometimes small movements of the antenna can aim the radio-waves more suitably for reaching a device in a certain area of your home. Try various positions, but be gentle with the antenna as it can break.
2. Ensure that the modem is not close to any large metallic objects (including appliances) which can impede radio waves.
3. If you have a Wet line, try moving the modem to a more central location in your home, as long as there is a phone wall jack nearby.
